APPENDIX 4C - Q4FY13 QUARTERLY CASH FLOW STATEMENT

Please find attached the Appendix 4C "Quarterly Report" for Emerchants Limited (**Company**) (ASX:EML) for the quarter and the 12 months to 30 June 2013 (**Q4FY13**)(**Report**).

The following are additional explanatory notes to be read in conjunction with the Report.

The Company completed the FY13 financial year with \$135m (FY12: \$100m) in total funds loaded through our systems. The margins earned on the total funds loaded remained consistent with prior years and consequently this has translated into a similar percentage increase in revenues over FY12.

Management have continued to reduce the cash overheads during the year and consequently the Company has seen a reduction in the expenses over the prior comparative year and prior comparative quarterly period

Management has been successful in applying for and receiving R&D grants in the prior fiscal years and intends to pursue such grants in the coming fiscal year. Should these grants be approved, they would be received in Q2 FY14. For the FY12 year, the Company received an R&D grant that was received by the Company in Q3 FY13, which represents a significant amount of the variance in cash outflows versus last quarter.

The outlook for the Company remains healthy, supported by a strong pipeline of revenue producing opportunities and inflows from existing, recently launched programmes and recently announced programs that will launch in market in the current quarter. The Company does not envisage a significant amount of capital expenditure in the near term and any capital requirements would be structured to coincide with materially significant opportunities.

The directors are satisfied that the Company has adequate funding, that its current balance sheet is sound, and that the Company complies with Listing Rule 12.2.

The table below summarises the quarterly progress, with key inflows and outflows described in further detail below.

Cash outflows from operations

Cash outflows from operations have improved over the prior comparative period due to the growth in revenue metrics (table 2) and continued cost control measures. The growth in Total Funds Loaded was achieved despite the strategic shift to re-loadable products in FY13, which have a longer sales cycle but offer more attractive, longer term revenue streams.

The last quarter is not reflective of the Company's annualised cash outflow run rate. Whilst we are undertaking the transition to a re-loadable prepaid debit business, a significant amount of revenues remain non-reloadable, and those products experience seasonality benefits in Q2 and into Q3, plus the likelihood of an R&D grant for the FY13 year.

Cash outflows from investing activities

The outflow in the current quarter relates to the acquisition of computer equipment and office furnishings.

As indicated in earlier submissions, management expect the net cash outflows from investing activities to be directly revenue dependant, with investing outflows on future product development largely offset by further inflows from cash accretive revenue opportunities or the following items:

- Remaining \$400k expected to be received in FY14 from Northern Territory mining tenement.
- Remaining \$40k proceed from the sale of the Johnny cake tenement pending approval from the Queensland Department of Natural Resources and Mines. This is anticipated to be received in 1HFY14.
- The Company continues to explore opportunities to sell its South Australian tenement at a price in the best interests of the Company.

Cash outflows from financing activities

The outflow from financing activities for the current quarter comprised the remaining settlement payment with the Globetrotter Group Pty Ltd. During the quarter the Company has fully extinguished the obligation with the Globetrotter Group Pty Ltd and has no remaining debt outstanding.

Performance based options

On the 21st September 2012, the Board of Directors approved the issuance of 10,250,000 unlisted performance based options to certain employees of the Company. The options are exercisable on the 21st September 2015 at an exercise price of \$0.15 subject to the achievement of audited financial targets in the FY15 year. The fair value of these equity-settled share based payments was estimated at the date of the grant using the Black and Scholes model to be a total of \$326,029. That amount is scheduled to be expensed over the 2013, 2014 and 2015 financial years.

On 13 November 2012 the shareholders at the Annual General Meeting approved the issue of 1,750,000 unlisted performance based options to Mr Thomas Cregan (Managing Director) to take up fully paid ordinary shares of the Company. The options are exercisable on 21st September 2015 at an exercise price of \$0.15 subject to the achievement of audited financial targets in the FY15 year. The fair value of these equity-settled share based payments was estimated at the date of the grant using the Black and Scholes model to be a total of \$116,231. That amount is scheduled to be expensed over the 2013, 2014 and 2015 financial years.

Bonus shares and Share Grant

On 3 August 2012 the Company issued 5,555,555 Shares (Bonus Shares) to Thomas Cregan and Associates Pty Ltd, a company controlled by Mr Thomas Cregan, under an employment agreement between the Company and Mr Cregan. This was approved by the shareholders at the Annual General Meeting on 13 November 2012 The fair value of these equity-settled share based payments was estimated at the date of the grant to be a total of \$500,000. That amount is scheduled to be expensed over the 2013, 2014 and 2015 financial years.

On 13 November 2012 the shareholders at the Annual General Meeting approved the issue of 3,888,888 fully paid ordinary shares of the Company (**Share Grant**) to Mr Peter Martin (Non-executive Director) in recognition of Mr. Martin's personal financial investment in the Company as well as his interest and commitment to the Company by joining and actively participating on the Board of Directors. The shares are to be held in escrow for 2 years. The fair value of the grant amounted to \$505,555 and was fully expensed in November 2012.
